Thank you for choosing to take the 6th Grade Social Studies class. The purpose of this course is to strengthen your academic skills in reading and writing while also learning the 5 piece approach to learning that is generally called social studies. This class will focus on teaching history, geography, civics, economics and sociology (culture). These are the studies that make up social studies. Like most social studies classes, we will learn through a historical lens; focusing on important historical time periods from the Stone Age up until the Renaissance.

This course will follow Arizona Standards for Social Studies for 6th Grade which is Early Civilizations to the Renaissance & Reformation.

- This course is broken down into modules. Within the modules, it is broken down by week.
- All assignments will have a due date.
- All work needs to be submitted to Canvas.
- Each week, an announcement will be posted for the course with updates and details about the week. It is extremely important you read and interact with those weekly announcements.
- Please use the messaging system in Canvas to communicate in this course.
- Most of your questions can be answered by reading the weekly announcements.

• Because this class is not like a course in the typical classroom, it requires participation through discussion boards. In order for this course to be effective, you must interact with the discussions. That is your class participation.

- An effort will be made to grade assignments each day, but all work submitted throughout the week will be graded before the start of the next week. That way, you know what your grade is each week.
- Make sure you read feedback so you can improve your work if needed. On most assignments, you are allowed to redo them if needed.

Participation is essential to your success in this class. In distance education courses you are required to participate just as if you were in a face-to-face course. This means that in order to get full credit for participation you will have to complete you discussion assignments, lesson assignments and quizzes on a timely basis.

This course will consist of discussion posts, weekly assignments, projects, quizzes, and tests. All will have a due date so you can plan accordingly. Looking at the calendar will show you all due dates.

Projects & Essays will be graded using a rubric. Rubrics help you understand what is expected for you for projects and essays. Rubrics can be found with the assignments.

If you have a question about a grade, message me through Canvas Inbox. Please do not post your personal questions in the group discussions.

• Anything turned in more than one week after the original due date, will be docked 15%.
